HB Blocks lifts productivity with Toyota forklifts

Darwin's leading manufacturer and supplier of concrete building blocks has commissioned a fleet of new Toyota forklifts to help boost productivity.

HB Blocks has four 3-tonne payload Toyota 8-FG30 forklifts on long-term rental and servicing agreement from the Toyota Material Handling Australia (TMHA) Darwin branch.

HB Blocks director Nick Halkitis said he chose the rental and servicing agreement to free-up space in the company workshop.

"The new Toyota forklifts are integral to the block production cycle, their storage and distribution," he said.

"They unload freshly made product, stack that product, make up and load orders, and handle pallets that need repair."

Mr Halkitis said the company bought its first Toyota forklift in 1997.

"It was soon followed by two more Toyotas, then another two, and now the four rental forklifts.

"Toyotas are good forklifts, especially for reliability and longevity, and they are backed by good local support from TMHA."

TMHA's factory-owned and backed Darwin branch is poised to celebrate its first anniversary after replacing the previous independent dealer last year.

HB Blocks can trace its beginnings to 1960 and the civil construction company Halkitis Brothers. The locally owned and operated business now employs close to 180 staff and is involved in construction, manufacturing, tourism, mining, transport and maintenance.

Toyota brand value leads the world

Toyota has strengthened its position as the world's most valuable automotive brand on the back of demand for hybrid vehicles, a rising Japanese economy and a rebound in the US car market.

Toyota's brand value surged by 21 per cent to US\$29.6 billion (A\$32.1 billion) over the past year compared with average rises of 17 per cent for the auto sector and 12 per cent for the top 100 brands.

It is the seventh time in nine years that Toyota has been crowned automotive brand value leader in the BrandZ[™]Top 100 Most Valuable Global Brands report.

Second and third places were taken by luxury German marques while only three other automotive companies were listed in the top 100.

The report said hybrid vehicles continued to do well with fuel efficiency and emissions shaping buyer preferences.

"It's not that shoppers preferred the styling or performance of those cars, but they wanted to enjoy the key benefit - fuel efficiency," it said.

"Toyota hybrid sales in Europe grew 43 per cent, driving strong profit for the brand in that region." Hybrid sales were up 30 per cent in the United States.

The report said another significant trend was that consumers expected cars loaded with technology, regardless of price point.

"Conditioned by rapid smartphone apps, they also expected car technology to improve with the speed of downloads," it said.

Safety remained an overriding concern. A key reason people traded-in cars after the third year of ownership was to upgrade to new safety features.

Toyota takes next steps in hybrid power



Toyota is undertaking significant developments in the laboratory and on the race track to advance future generations of hybrid vehicles such as Prius and Camry.

The world's largest producer of petrol-electric hybrid vehicles is targeting gains to performance and fuel efficiency that will extend its lead in hybrid technology.

In Japan, Toyota has announced a new generation of computer chips with the potential to boost the fuel efficiency of its hybrid vehicles by 10 per cent* while significantly reducing the size of the crucial power control unit (PCU).

The latest laboratory breakthrough announced by Toyota involves new silicon carbide computer chips (power semi-conductors) that are substantially more efficient than today's chips made from silicon alone.

Designed to be used in the PCU of hybrid vehicles, they will enable Toyota to improve fuel efficiency by up to 10 per cent while also reducing PCU size by up to 80 per cent.

The newly developed silicon carbide chips - which will undergo on-road testing in Japan within a year - reduce the amount of current lost as heat, and switch the current flow on and off more efficiently.

This enables the coil and capacitor, which account for approximately 40 per cent of the size of the PCU, to be reduced in size.

The PCU in hybrid vehicles supplies electric power from the battery to the motor to control vehicle speed. It also sends electricity generated through deceleration to the battery for storage.

An estimated 20 per cent of the total power loss in hybrid vehicles is associated with the power semiconductors alone. Therefore, a key way to improve fuel efficiency is to improve power semi-conductor efficiency.
